





HIGHLIGHTS

God is at work in local Covenant churches and ministries of the Central Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church (CCECC). We are grateful that we are moving mission forward together in our conference.

We praise God for the hospitality shown to us by the members of the host church, Libertyville Covenant Church in Libertyville, IL! They opened their doors to us for this three-day event. Here are some highlights from Celebration 2025, held on May 1-3.

We had over **240 registered participants** at this inperson event. This included 111 Covenant ministers and additional guests who attended the Central Conference Ministerial Association (CCMA) Annual Meeting (May 1-2). There were also 92 delegates and additional guests who attended the CCECC Annual Meeting (May 2-3), and Harbor Point Ministries Annual Meeting (May 3).

In addition to delegates and ministers, **we had several special guests join us,** including Rev. Dr. Kanyere Eaton, Covenant minister from the Bronx, NY, who proclaimed the Word on Thursday evening. Her sermon was about the Samaritan woman, found in John 4. Rev. Dr. Danny Martinez preached on Friday evening on Numbers 4, addressing the Celebration 2025 theme of "Moving Mission Forward Together." We were led in vibrant worship over the three days by Leslie Hodgkinson and Desiree Robertson. You may find the worship services on the <u>CCECC</u> <u>YouTube channel</u>.

Participants were also able to attend **workshops on Friday afternoon on a variety of topics**, including: learning about spiritual direction, led by Bob Tenglin; a study on church board effectiveness and team emotional intelligence led by Chris Hackett; trauma informed ministry in the church led by Meagan Gillan; safeguarding our children at church led by Emma Mueller; and a workshop for our Spanish speakers led by Abraham Bejarano. **CCECC Treasurer Susan Kauffman,** presented the 2025 -26 revised Central Conference budget, as well as the proposed 2026-27 budget. The budgets were approved by the delegates.

The CCECC has one church being removed from the roster of ECC churches in 2025:

• Iglesia del Pacto Nuevo Amanecer, Chicago, IL, has merged with another church to form a new church.

The CCECC is welcoming **three churches** that are **joining the ECC** in 2025:

- Iglesia Restauracion del Covenant, Chicago, IL. This church has arisen from the merger of two churches: Sobre La Roca Church and Iglesia Nuevo Amanecer.

The Central Conference currently has one church plant: Bethany Covenant Church, St. Charles, IL, led by Pastor Laura Tarro. There are two additional church plants that are preparing to enter into formal church planting partnerships with the CCECC and the ECC in 2025.

Superintendent Danny Martinez reported on ministry in the Central Conference. He emphasized the need to work together and also to resource and train the whole church to mobilize. To this end, the Central Conference is offering several leadership training opportunities in 2025:
